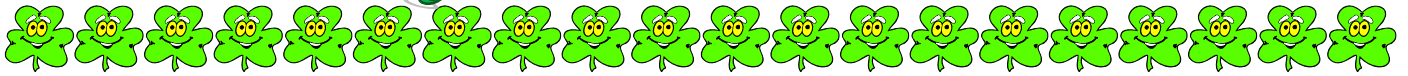

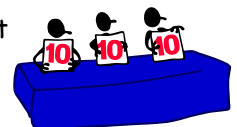

Is green, green, green!



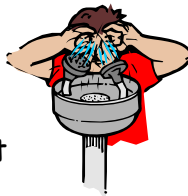
And Irish tunes they whistle

## Tried & Tested Recipe



### **King Cake with Cream Cheese Filling**

2 tubes (8 oz each) refrigerated low fat Crescent Rolls  
4 oz light cream cheese  
2 tlbs confectioners' sugar  
1 tsp vanilla extract  
1/3 cup light brown sugar  
2 tlbs butter, softened  
3 tsp ground cinnamon

#### Icing:

1 cup confectioners' sugar  
1-2 tlbs 2% milk  
1/2 tsp vanilla extract  
Red & blue, (or purple); yellow & green food colouring

Unroll both tubes of crescent dough and separate into triangles. Place triangles on a greased 12 inch pizza pan, forming a ring with pointed ends facing toward the center and wide ends overlapping. Lightly press wide ends together. In a small bowl, beat cream cheese, confectioners' sugar and vanilla until smooth. Spoon the mixture over wide ends of ring. In another bowl, mix the brown sugar, butter and cinnamon until crumbly. Sprinkle over cream cheese mixture. Fold points over filling and fold wide ends over points. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes or until golden brown. Cool 5 minutes. Drizzle purple, yellow & green icing sugar on triangles to resemble a crown on the cake. Serve warm. Flaky and delicious!
