



In The Spotlight:

Gordon Bradley - Belview by the Bay

Mr. Bradley was in the R.C.A.F. from 1943 – 1946 when he was Honourably Discharged. He found there was nothing for him in civilian life so he re-enlisted and spent another 15 years in the R.C.A.F. His two brothers and two sons also served. He was later hired by the Town of Ajax as Recreation Director.

After enlisting he was sent to England and later to Burma where he helped to liberate Rangoon. A local man, Don Corbett, told Mr. Bradley that his father had been a prisoner when Rangoon was liberated and it was Mr. Bradley's skipper who helped to free him.
